



Summary

A short, easy hike around the harbor north of Sisimiut, including "Dog Town".

The trail is very obvious as it follows a built gravel track or roads. It is suitable for mountain bikes and also during the winter.

LEAVE NO TRACE

- Follow the marked trail
- Carry out all trash
- No fires. Be careful of cigarettes
- Do not disturb wildlife
- Respect the tranquility of nature



SAFETY FIRST

- All passage is at your own risk
- Some trail sections may not have cellphone reception
- Refill water from any stream
- Watch the weather
- Be careful of slippery and unstable surfaces

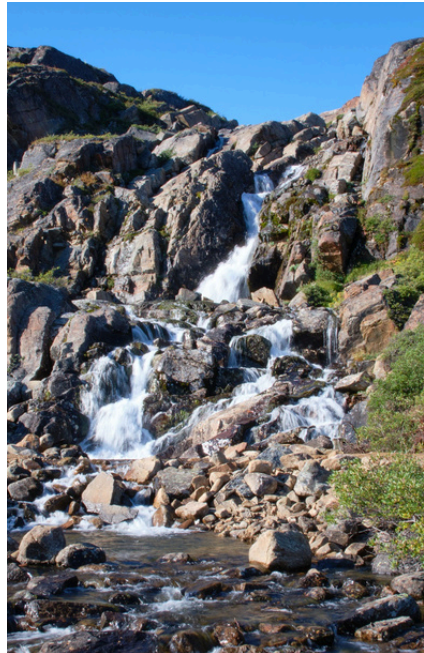

TRAIL DESCRIPTION

The easiest direction of travel starts at the bridge near the harbour and follows the road towards Sisimiut's newest suburb of Akia. At the end of the houses, it changes into a short ATV track, before changing once more into a wide, obvious gravel trail over natural ground.

The trail follows the northern edge of the inlet towards the east and offers wonderful views over the town and both Nasaasaq and Oqummianguaq mountains.



At the end of the inlet, you will find a beautiful waterfall. Cross the base of the waterfall by hopping over rocks, then continue hiking beneath a nearby hut. From there, climb over a small hill and down to the large river that that drains from Sisimiut's drinking water supply.

The trail then turns to the east and follows the river to link up with the road that passes through dog town.

Remember, do not approach adult Greenlandic sled dogs without their owner present.

But enjoy the antics of the puppies as you make your way back to the paved roads of Sisimiut. Then, choose your own adventure to wherever you want to head next. The route suggested here takes you along the southern shore of the bay past the marina – a part of Sisimiut you might otherwise not think to explore.
